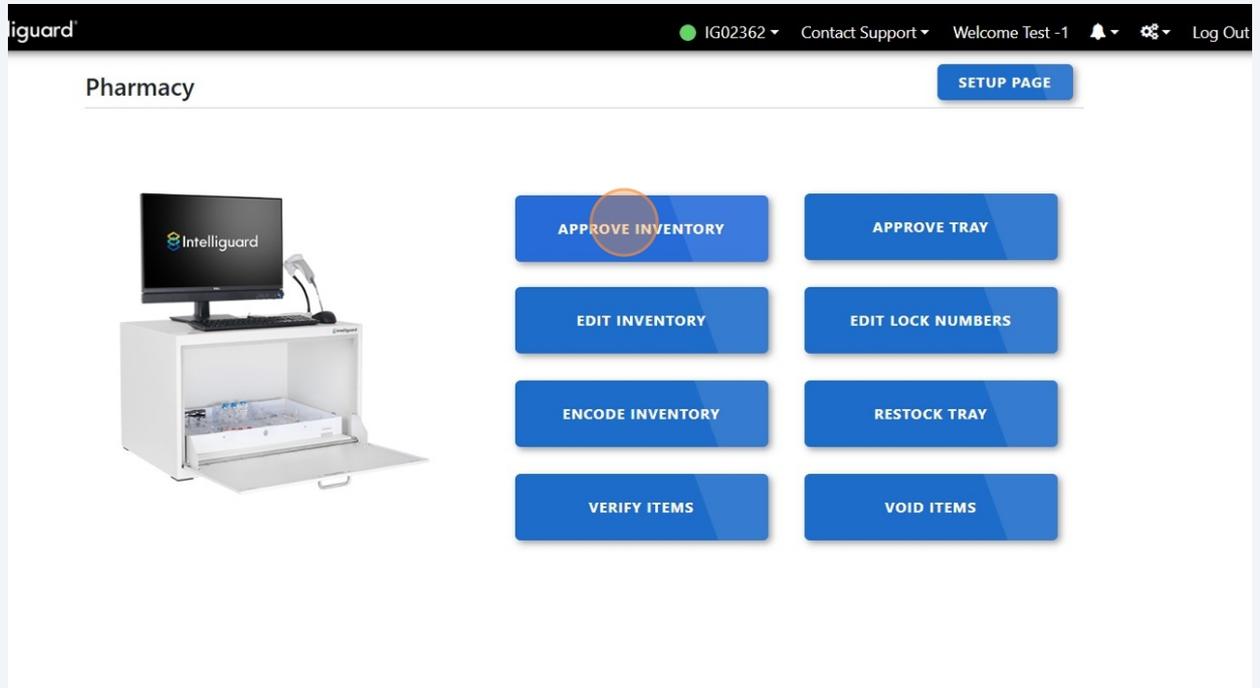


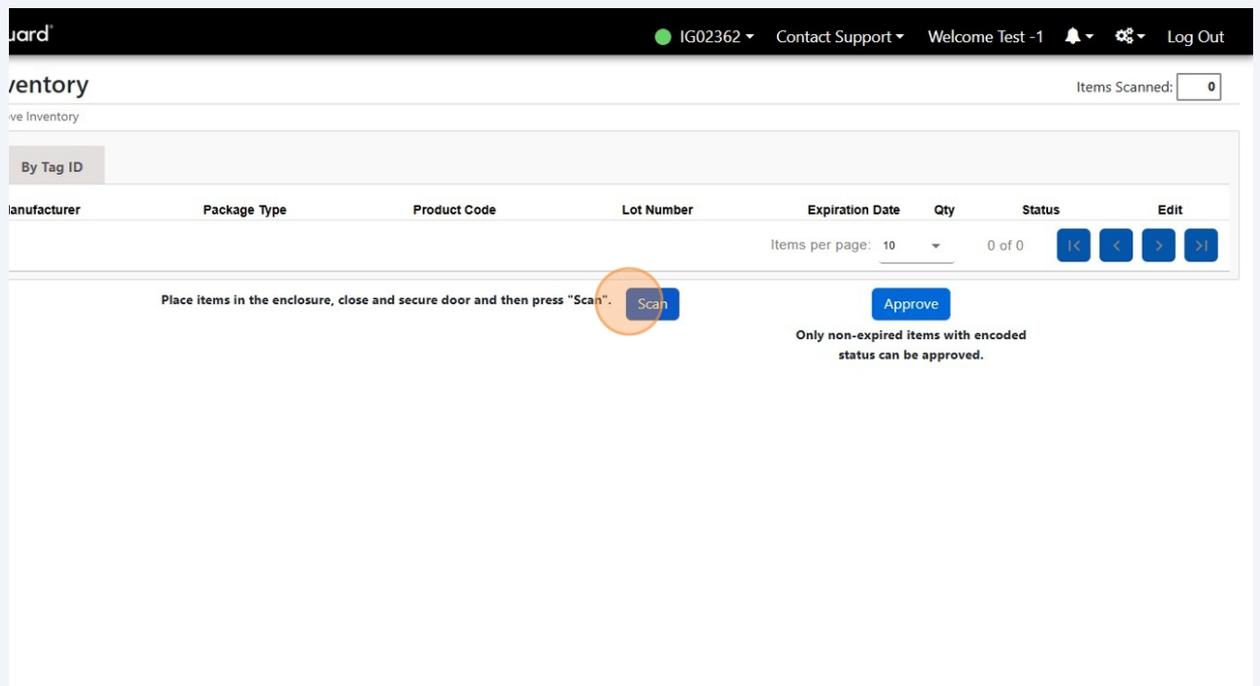
# How To Approve Pharmacy Inventory
